


To create a permanent residence and accommodate their visiting children, the couple purchased an adjacent apartment and decided

to combine the two spaces into one. They then called upon designer Cheri Lynn Friedman, who had worked with the owners on four other projects. "I listened closely to find out what they wanted to do with the space," Friedman says. "The husband wanted a study. The wife likes to entertain, so she wanted a larger dining room. They also needed a guestroom for visitors, and they wanted to enjoy the ocean views from their terrace."

Friedman moved and knocked down walls to


meet the couple's varied needs. She created a study from one unit's original kitchen, and a spacious dining area from an extra living room. Her new floorplan also opened up the space to allow for a sitting area that converts into a guestroom.

"To give the feeling that both units were always one, Friedman continued the use of the same limestone flooring throughout," the husband says.

Working closely with the owners, both dedicated art lovers and collectors, Friedman filled the

restructured interior with contemporary furnishings and artwork, antiques and accessories, and used them in innovative ways. To tie everything together, she maintained a palette of green, cream, caramel and earth tones. "I did a modern design with contemporary furnishings," Friedman says. "I made it clean-lined yet cozy; personal with whimsical accessories, yet elegant. I wanted it to be comfortable and exciting — like Palm Beach."

Her imaginative approach immediately appears

in the living room, where medium-green walls offer a complementary backdrop for a pair of cutvelvet sofas patterned with green squares. An oversized cocktail table topped with blue marble, and a round game table covered in a mosaic of glass tiles reinforce the palette. A cream shag area rug injects a subtle retro undertone.

The dining room also showcases Friedman's eclectic blend, starting with 19th-century rosewood columns that set the stage for the burnished-








ABOVE LEFT: In the sitting area, an abstract green painting by Pandit Khairnar disguises a hidden doorway into the master suite.

LEFT: Glass bamboo wall tiles from Ann Sacks take their cues from the bamboo-framed, floor-length mirror in the powder room.




wood tones throughout. Modern and antique furnishings — including a clean-lined hickory table that accommodates up to 14 guests, a traditional 19th-century French buffet, island chairs and a contemporary console — form a fusion of styles.

More surprising elements await in the sitting area located off the living room. "I wanted this area to issue an invitation," Friedman says. "I wanted it

to be so striking that those who enter would linger." To that end, she juxtaposes a trio of classic green-and-beige upholstered club chairs with a bold modern painting.

Friedman's talent for creative combinations continues in the study, where burnished, cherrywood paneling frames prints of antique globes, enhancing the room's traditional tone. For a modern



touch, a creamy leather sofa and sleek metallic cocktail tables create a conversation area.

Even the powder room incorporates Friedman's original design concepts. Here, a bamboo-framed mirror and glass wall tiles designed to look like bamboo offer a refined take on tropical style.

In the master bedroom, Friedman imbues the design with a calming, eclectic air. A clean-lined zebrawood bed with quilted white bed coverings, wood bedside chests and an antique armchair rest

against a backdrop of pale green walls and creamy wool carpet. The adjacent sitting area also features an array of unique pieces, such as a mid 19th-century Georgian chest, cube cocktail tables and an amberglass lamp. A plump, sage-green suede sofa and dark wood lounge chair offer comfortable seating.

"With her many original combinations, Friedman has demonstrated a wonderful ability to seamlessly blend Palm Beach style with our personality and unique collection," the husband says.
